We are journeying through the book of Acts and how the apostles got through the trauma, drama and challenge of the Crucifixion and Resurrection and applied that to their lives and the Church. Together we will see what insights this gives us for today.

Our Nurturing God and Happy Mother's Day!

The Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit are the three persons of the one Holy and Undivided God. They are the way we get to know the unknowable. Centuries of grammar have translated the grammar and pronouns of our Christian God as masculine. But it may surprise you to know that the Ruah, Tin, rūaḥ, breath of God, the Holy Spirit present in the Hebrew Scriptures was feminine. In Greek, the word closest to this was <u>Tveõµa</u>, *pneûma*, which was gender neutral. It was not until the Scriptures were translated into Latin that the breath of God became "Spiritus" which is masculine.

Early Church Fathers (theologians and teachers) <u>Theophilus of Anti-och</u> (d. 180) and by <u>Irenaeus</u> (d. 202/3) taught about the femininity of God in the wisdom texts, and <u>Gregory of Nazianzus</u> in the fourth century wrote that terms like "Father" and "Son" in reference to the persons of the trinity are not to be understood as expressing <u>essences or energies</u> of God but are to be understood as metaphors. The same position is still held in the 1992 <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>.

In honor of Mothers and Mothering I hope you enjoy meditating on these Scriptures that emphasize God's nurture and care.

"Humankind was created as God's reflection: in the divine image God created them; female and male, God made them."

God: "Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I who took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them."

Hosea 13:8 God described as a mother bear

"Like a bear robbed of her cubs, I will attack them and tear them asunder..."

Deuteronomy 32:11-12 God described as a mother eagle

"Like the eagle that stirs up its nest, and hovers over its young, God spreads wings to catch you, and carries you on pinions."

Deuteronomy 32:18 God who gives birth

"You were unmindful of the Rock that bore you; you forgot the God who gave you birth."

Isaiah 66:13 God as a comforting mother

God: "As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusa-lem."

Isaiah 49:15 God compared to a nursing mother

God: "Can a woman forget her nursing child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you."

Isaiah 42:14 God as a woman in labor

God: "For a long time I have held my peace, I have kept myself still and restrained myself; now I will cry out like a woman in labor, I will gasp and pant."

Psalm 131:2 God as a Mother

"But I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a weaned child with its mother; my soul is like the weaned child that is with me."

Psalm 123:2-3 God compared to a woman

"As the eyes of a servant looks to the hand of their master, as the eyes of a maid to the hand of her mistress, so our eyes look to you, YHWH, until you show us your mercy!"

Matthew 23:37 and Luke 13:34 God as a Mother Hen

Jesus: "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!"

Luke 15:8-10 God as woman looking for her lost coin

Jesus: "Or what woman having ten silver coins, is she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.' Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

March 2022 Treasurer's Report, respectfully submitted by Terry Garman.

My apology for a somewhat abbreviated treasurer's report this month. I'm still having some issues with QuickBooks. Our bookkeeper has some possible solutions but it's important that she gets up to speed on our system before she spends time on my problem. The financial health of Nativity remains strong. Our Plate/Pledge income for the first two months was \$58,449, which is an increase of \$13,698 over last year. This includes two large pledges, and the SDA offset of over \$1500.00 which continues through April. It also includes the \$656.00 proceeds of the jazz concert. This is not to be considered a trend because it has only been for two months. Expenses are currently under control and all bills are being paid on time. As always, the Finance Committee will review the budget each quarter to determine if adjustments are necessary. We are in a very good financial position, with a \$13,698 increase since last year. **Motion:**

Ron Herman made a motion to accept the March 2022 Treasurer's Report. Vasco Coombs seconded the motion. The Vestry voted to approve.

Relief for Ukraine

Mother Tracy asks the vestry consider authorizing a special collection to be taken up March 27th (Rose Sunday) for the Ukraine. Traditionally, the loose plate goes to Mother Tracy's discretion fund on the 4th Sunday of the month. She has asked that all loose monies in the plate that day go to the Ukraine. Additionally, those wishing to write a check can make it out to church of the Nativity with "Ukraine" written on the memo line.

All funds raised by the Southeast Deanery Churches will be pooled together and matched by the Lilly Grant, up to \$5000.00 dollars. This will be sent to the Ukraine via the Episcopal Relief and Development Fund, working with refugees and immediate aid needs.

This "matching funds" opportunity would allow Nativity to double its gift to this much needed relief cause.

Motion:

Vasco Coombs made a motion to distribute the Rose Sunday collection as outlined above for Ukrainian Relief.

Ron Herman seconded the motion.

The Vestry voted to approve.
