

# Update from the Treasurer

This is an update to keep you aware of the financial health of Nativity and I'm happy to say our financial health is good.

The finance committee regularly reviews our actual income and expense compared to the budgeted income and expense. A determination is then made as to whether or not any adjustments to the budget are necessary. Thus far in 2022, we have not made any adjustments to the budget. In fact, the budget expected a net loss of \$12,301 as of July 1, 2022. We actually had a net income of \$1,631.

Our Balance Sheet is also sound. Our checking account balance is very good, but that's primarily because of two programs which provided an infusion of \$92,349 over a two-year period (2020 & 2021). We applied and received the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan (\$56,349) during those two years. This was a government sponsored program to provide financial assistance because of COVID. While this is called a "loan," it was interest free and no pay-back required. During that same two-year period, we also had a program called SDA Offset. Because of COVID, the Seventh Day Adventists were not able to use the Church, and we lost that income. Fortunately, two parishioners developed the SDA Offset program and secured commitments from twelve parishioners/families to offset that monthly income during this two-year period. Both these programs, while no longer active, were very helpful as we navigated through unknown COVID waters.

We continue to make extra principal payments on the mortgage and we are on track to satisfy the mortgage in 2032.

In summary, the financial health of Nativity is good, but the finance committee will continue to regularly review our income and expense and make budget adjustments as necessary. Thank you all for your continued support to Nativity.

#### Walkway Report: Repairs completed

**Treasurer's Report:** <u>Treasurer's Report Respectfully Submitted by Terry Garman</u> I've attached two reports, one showing the P&L for the first five months and the other showing monthly income vs expense. The P&L shows a net income of \$19,952.72 but that does not include the principal expense. After deducting the principal costs, we still have a net income of \$7,032. The other report is a crude line chart of monthly income vs monthly expense. This shows how income and expense fluctuate from month to month. I plan to include this line chart every month.

Although the Balance Sheet is not included in this report, it's worth noting that the checking account is \$26,790 less than last year at this time. I attribute that to the fact that we received a PPP loan last year plus we received the monthly SDA Offset funds. Both those are no longer active. While our total equity has increased by \$146,396, I attribute that to receipt of the BOAZ fund. It's difficult to accurately compare the balance sheet to last year because of those "one-time" exceptions.

In summary, our income is sufficient to meet expenses and our balance sheet shows slow and steady progress in the financial health of Nativity. At the end of the second quarter, the finance committee will do a detailed review of our financial condition to determine if adjustments are necessary.
