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

1. Rector's Report Respectfully Submitted by Mother Tracy Dugger:

- **a. Pastoral Care:** visits to Jane Oliver, Hyacinth deRoche', Iverine Raffington, and various phone calls, committal for Philbert Roach held.
- **b. Diocesan:** I will be taking a parishioner to the Conference on Ministry August 25th in Winter Garden, FL, this conference is for those discerning a call to licensed lay preaching, deaconate, or priesthood.
- **c.** Youth and Family: We had a great family movie night and a successful kick off Sunday. We will discuss the movie night more.
- **d. Continuing Education:** Experiments in Ministry Team planned for Lemonade and Cookies to our School Children
- e. Changeover from Icon to ACS Acs is now active and Melissa, Carol and I will be taking the next month to review the data transferred is correct, update the books, and then begin to utilize the financial services in a month or so. Icon will be deactivated after August.
- f. Website: The new website is live and active, we are no longer paying for the old company and everything will be done through HostGator in the future. Carol is able to update the newsletter on the new website. NOTE: the old domain churchofthenativitypsl.com has been redirected to nativitypsl.com for 2 years. Churchofthenativitypsl.com is now expiring and would cost \$289 to continue to hold. It is the recommendation of Mother Tracy that we allow that domain to lapse and continue forward only with nativitypsl.com. Approval of Consent Agenda constitutes approving this lapse.
- g. **Safety Team:** An initial meeting of the safety team was held August 4th with a 4 person team comprised of 2 law enforcement/security training individuals, a vestry person, and a nurse.
- h. **Group Exercise Class:** Christine Fenerty has agreed to teach our class beginning Friday September 9th at 9:30 am. Chair Yoga will be offered.

Audit Report: Please see attached Report, of the Audit Committee. Thank you to Deborah Benway, Wendy Chadbourne, and Neville Lake for their time and talents. The vestry needs to vote to approve the audit for submission to the diocese of Central Florida. Mother Tracy, Melissa Lewis, Terry Garman and Deborah Benway met on August 1st to discuss the audit and implementation of its recommendations. We need 2 votes, 1 to accept the audit, and 1 for the resolutions.

Motion:

Vestry Financial Resolutions

Vestry of Church of the Nativity Pursuant to the 2021 Calendar Year Audit resolves:

- Check Policy: All checks require 2 authorized signatures regardless of monetary amount
- Designated Signors: Authorizes signers are to be the Rector, the Senior Warden, the Junior Warden.
- Emergency Authorization signor: The treasurer is designated as an authorized signer in the event of the unavailability of the other authorized signers to prevent late payments etc.
- Signature Exemplars: A sample of each authorized signature is to be kept on file in the audit book to verify proper signature/identity in the audit

- Check Request Form: A check request form will be utilized for all reimbursement checks issued to individuals on behalf of church of the Nativity. This form is not required for regular recurrent bill pay.
- Notes from finance committee meetings shall be taken and retained for the audit, and to be included in the treasurers' report.

This resolution shall go into effect immediately, but will be binding beginning January 1st 2023, for the purposes of our future audits.

Motion:

Treasurer's report respectfully submitted by Terry Garman, Treasurer:

Attached to this report is the Profit & Expense (1-1-2022 to 7-31-2022) and the Income vs Expense

Line Chart (through 7 months 2022).

We've experienced a net loss of \$18,202.42 through seven months. The average monthly expense exceeded the average monthly income by \$2,600/Mo. During that same seven-month period, the operating fund (checking acct.) balance was reduced by an average of \$2,007/Mo. In other words, it appears our monthly income shortfall is being subsidized by the unused PPP funds remaining in the checking account. While this is not an immediate problem, it is not sustainable.

The attached line chart shows that in five of the seven months, expenses exceeded income. As far as I can tell, our expenses are reasonable, necessary and not frivolous. We don't have an expense problem; we have an income problem. All bills are paid on time and the checking account is still healthy. We still have unused PPP loan funds in the checking account Assuming we continue on the same income/expense trajectory for the remainder of the year, it would result in withdrawing \$13,000 from the checking account just to cover the income shortfall. As of now, the checking account could withstand that withdrawal, but I would not agree to allowing it to continue into 2023. My recommendation to the finance committee was to not make any budget adjustments and continue to monitor the financial situation. The finance committee has agreed to not adjusting the budget and continuing to closely monitor the budget. Along with advice from the executive council, it was decided that the finance committee and the stewardship committee meet to begin discussions on how to move forward with the goal of increasing income. That meeting is scheduled for August 22. The 2021 Audit has been completed. The recommendations were mostly minor but necessary to meet Diocesan and accounting requirements. Mother Tracy, Deborah Benway, Melissa Lewis and myself met July 1, 2022, to clarify the recommendations and begin implementation of

necessary changes.

Tracy proposed take time to continue with heavy emphasis on raising income for next year. Sept mtg to focus on input from Committee and Vestry, what expenses can be cut.

Motion:

Ron Herman made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report for July 2022. Judy Klimczak seconded the motion. The Vestry voted to approve.
