Hurricane Ian blessed us with rain, winds, and snowing shingles here at church. As many of you know the church has been saving for a roof for sometime in the building fund. Because of the storm we are now required to get a new roof. This will cost approximately \$40,000. Fortunately, the Church Insurance Company of Vermont has sent us a check for \$27,924.46. This means the total cost of the roof to our building fund will be \$12,075.54. Our current balance is sufficient to cover this cost, but will deplete some of our reserves. Anyone wishing to give over and above their regular offering to help offset this cost can do so by writing a check to our building fund. Due to good stewardship, and good insurance, we will have a new roof soon.

Whenever that happens (based on permitting and scheduling) we ask that you use patience and caution around our campus as the giant squirrels, aka roofers, do their work!

#### **CONSENT AGENDA:**

1. Rector's Report Respectfully Submitted by Mother Tracy Dugger:

- a. Pastoral Care: Made several visits to homebound parishioners and some hospital and facility visits. Including end of life care to 2 parishioners.
- b. Diocesan: Attended a seminar on trauma-informed liturgy.
- c. Youth and Family: We have some newly more active families and continue to work with scouts as an outreach. 3 of our Youth will receive their religious medal certification For Duty to God this Children and Family Sunday.
- d. Continuing Education: Experiments in Ministry, the cookies and lemonade resulted in a just a few interactions, but the exercise class is going well. With attendance of 15 our first week and 17 the next. We are also connecting for the first time with a few online members. Our final experiment will be the October Movie Night and my final trip to Virginia in November to finish out the Missional Leadership Cohort.
- e. Changeover from Icon to ACS The directory has been updated to reflect the active folks now in ACS and we are beginning migration of the counters to a new simpler system with acs.
- f. Safety Team: A 20 page security assessment was conducted by the St. Lucie county sheriffs department. The Team will be presenting a summary of the recommendations next month.

Request for approval of Scout Sunday Popcorn Sales between the two services on Sunday, September 25<sup>th</sup>

Allow scouts to sell popcorn one Sunday per month. Motion to accept from Vasco Coombs, seconded by Terry Garman. The Vestry approved

**Review of Outdoor Movie Night:** Nightmare Before Christmas will be Screened October 21st at 7:15 pm.

Worship Experience Committee: October is Clergy Appreciation Month. We would like to recommend to the vestry an invitation be issued to The Rev. Mary Rosendahl, The Rev. Robert Brandt, and Mrs. Sandy Wolfe to attend worship with us on October 16th to receive a small gift of appreciation within our Pledge Campaign of "Celebrating Our Past, Securing Our Future." A small gift for Mother Tracy was also discussed.

Ron Herman made a motion to authorize a \$100 gift for each person. Seconded by Wendy Chadbourne. The Vestry approved

#### **Vestry Financial Considerations to Decrease Deficit in 2023**

#### **Ideas Presented from Finance Committee**

- 1. Attempt to Increase Stewardship
- 2. Reduce Rector Pay to move from ASA 100-150 size church to an up to 100 ASA church. We are at 30-35 at the 8:00 service and 65-70 at the later service. This would be a reduction of \$1,900 per year. Mother Tracy finds this acceptable if her total time off package is increased by 1 week to compensate. To begin January 1st, 2023.

## Ron Herman made a motion to begin Jan. 1, 2023, seconded by Viola Gittens. Vestry approved

3. Reduce Sexton/Facilities Ministers Hours: Recommended beginning OCTOBER 1st, reduce from 10 hours per week to 5 hours per week. A \$3,900 per year reduction. Current facilities minister Will Dugger is amenable to this change and would shift from cleaning 2 times per week to once. New hours 9am-12n

## Ron Herman made the motion to accept the reduction, seconded by Terry Garman. Vestry approved

- **4.** Reduce Extra Principal Payment. To pay our loan of by its original end date, before refinancing we have been paying \$1,100 extra per month. This could be suspended for a time, but is not highly recommended to do so.
- 5. Reduce Summer Hours of Office from 9-2 Monday-Thursday. Effects are a \$108 per week reduction in payroll for Admin, and lowered utility bills during our hottest months. Summer is also our slowest financial season.
- **6.** Renegotiate with Hazel to have a reduced rate during the summer when there is no choir.

#### Would mean a \$4800 savings for items 2 & 3

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's Report respectfully submitted by Terry Garman, Treasurer:

Treasurer's Report: Respectfully submitted by Terry Garman: Our balance sheet is relatively strong but we continue to have a negative income stream. The attached P&L Budget vs Actual shows a net loss of \$14,881 through eight months. That's an average monthly loss of \$1,860. The Stewardship committee and the Finance committee had a joint meeting August 22. Certain budget adjustments were discussed and remain on the table pending the results of the 2023 pledge campaign. It was also decided to have a committee member/parishioner speak briefly at each Sunday service beginning September 25 and continuing to All Saints Day. It's important that the parishioners understand our negative cash flow situation and at the same time be reminded of all the good things that have happened at Nativity over the past few years, in spite of the restrictions placed on us by Covid.

### Update from the Treasurer

I reported earlier that our average monthly income shortfall at the end of July was \$2,500 per month. We now have two more months of data and unfortunately our shortfall is not only continuing, it's increasing. Our average monthly shortfall through nine months is now \$4,210 per month.

It's still early in the 2023 pledge campaign. As of the writing of this article, we've received 11 pledges for a total of \$8,010.
