11. Vietnamese: Cảm ơn (Thanks), Cảm ơn bạn (Thank you), Cảm ơn bạn rất nhiều (Thank you very much)

12. Arabic: شكرًا Thank you [šukran], شكرًا على كلامك اللطيف Thanks for your kind words [šokran 'alā kalāmak el·la], شكرا على Thanks for your kind of you [dah karam menna]

13. Polish: Dzięki (Thanks), Dziękuję (Thank You) (Note that dziękuję – or nie, dziękuję – can also be used to refuse an offer, as in "no, thanks), Stokrotne dzięki (Many thanks), Wielkie dzięki (Thanks alot)

14. Croatian: Hvala (Thank You), Puno hvala / Hvala lijepa (Thanks a lot), Hvala najljepša literary / Baš ti hvala colloquial (Thank you really)

15. Danish: Tak (Thank you), Mange tak (Thank you so much), Tak skal du have (Thanks alot)

16. Czech: Děkuji vám (Thank you), To je od vás velmi laskavé (That's very kind of you), Díky moc! (Thanks a lot!)

17. Estonian: Tänan (Thank you), Aitäh (Thanks), Tänan väga (Thank you very much)

18. Finnish: Kiitos (Thank you), Kiitos ystävällisistä sanoistasi! (Thank you for your kind words), Kiitos paljon! (Thanks a lot)

19. Greek: **Σ' ευχαριστώ!** [S' efharistó!] I thank you (singular – less formal), **Σας ευχαριστώ!** [Sas efharistó!] Thank you (plural – formal), **Σας ευχαριστούμε!** [Sas efharist**ού**me!] We thank you

20. Hawaiian: Mahalo (Thank you), Mahalo nui loa (Thank you very much)

21. Hindi: धन्यवाद [dhun-yuh-vaad] Thank you (pure Hindi), बहुत शुक्रिया or बहुत धन्यवाद [bahut shu-kri-yaa or bahut dhun-yuh-vaad] Thank you very much, शुक्रिया [shu-kri-yaa] Thanks (colloquial Hindi)

22. Indonesian: Terima kasih (Thank you), Anda sungguh baik hati (Thank you kindly), Terima kasih banyak (Thanks a lot)

23. Japanese: ありがとう [Arigatou] Thanks, ありがとうございます [Arigatou gozaimasu] Thank you, どうもありがとう [Doumo arigatou] Thank you kindly, どうもありがとうございます[Doumo Arigatou gozaimasu] Thank you very much

24. Latvian: Paldies (Thank you), Liels paldies (Thank you very much), Paldies par jūsu viesmīlību (Thank you for your hospitality)

25. Romanian: Mulţumesc (Thank you), Este foarte amabil din partea dumneavoastră (That's very kind of you), Vă mulţumim pentru cuvintele frumoase (Thanks for your kind words)

26. Swahili: Shurkan (Thanks) – mostly used in oral communication, Shukran sana (Thanks a lot) – mostly used in oral communication, Asante (Thank you), Asante Sana (Thanks a lot)

27. Thai: ขอบคุณ [khawp khun] (Thank you), ขอบใจนะ [khawp jai] (Thanks)

28. Filipino: Salamat sa-LAH-mat (Thank you), Napakabuti ninyo (That's very kind of you), Salamat sa iyong mga papuri (Thanks for your kind words)

29. Slovak: Ďakujem JAH-koo-yehm (I thank you), Ďakujeme (We thank you), Ďakujem mnohokrát (Thanks a lot)

30. Norwegian: Takk skal du ha (Thank you), Takk for hjelpen (Thanks for your help), Tusen takk (Thousand thanks)

Financial report –

September 2023 Treasurer's Report Respectfully Submitted by Wendy Chadbourne

As of the end of August we are showing a net loss of \$9,786 on our P&L. In reality we are at net loss of \$20,686.00. Our advanced pledge amount balance as of the end of August is \$10,900.

Our Balance sheet showed a decrease over July of \$12,180.

In August we received an advance pledges in the amount of \$1,250, we also received additional plate contributions thru PayPal of \$1089.11 and September rent from ActonAcademy for \$2200.

Comparing the total net loss for 2022 which was \$40,308, 8 months into 2023 we are at a net loss of \$20,686. Through August of 2022 we had a net loss of \$14,881. Compared to date for August last year we are not doing as well, but compared to the whole of last year we are not doing as bad. With four months left to go for the year we should see some improvement in our finances, with respect to Acton Academy, pledges picking back up now that summer is over, and not making the extra principal payments every month.

Terry Garman brought up his concerns about the fact that we continue to show a deficit in spite of the fact that additional principal payments have been eliminated, Acton Academy income is being received and some full annual pledge payments have been received. Our expenses are not out of line, our problem is insufficient income to cover those expenses. After third quarter financial data is available, he suggested the finance committee meet to discuss options to lessen our deficit.

Rose Skeete made motion to accept the Treasurers report, seconded by Viola Gittens, Vestry approved

And Approving last months minutes. -Deborah Benway made motion to accept the August Minutes, Wendy Chadbourne seconded, Vestry approved

Vestry discussed the Time & Talent Adult Commitment form and he various responsibilities
