### Memorial Garden Update

Since the last update, our revised site plan was finally submitted back to the City for approval on July 15th. Unfortunately, we have not yet received approval as of this Herald but expect it to come through any time. In the meantime, I will update you on the landscaping plan/changes going forward.

- We completed re-mulching of the North side after a full day of work on Monday, August 5th. They went over the entire site to further grind all the previously mulched areas. They also removed multiple invasive Scheflerra trees from the preserve area. The site looked great now we must keep it maintained!
- The additional mulching and tree removal was very effective and much of the land can be mowed going forward. We had budgeted increased maintenance in the budget for 2024 but were unable to mow it until now. Following mulching round two, we were able to negotiate the following with our current landscape contractor: mowing and trimming of the entire site, including garden and preserve areas, every two weeks on Saturday; all garden debris pickup/removal; and hedge trimming as needed for a total of \$525 per month. We will monitor to gauge performance. As Deborah reported, the City mows the grass between the sidewalks and Del Rio Blvd – she put in a call because they had fallen behind due to rain.
- The Scouts are interested in taking on regular maintenance/gardening activities on site to include upkeep of the Flag Garden. We will be developing a work plan with Scout Leaders in the next month.

Hopefully, we will get final approval very soon and will begin planting Clusia shrubs before the next Herald newsletter. Before and after photos are found here and on the next page, if you haven't been out to see the work.
