Happy October Nativity Family,

I am grateful for your participation in our Eleven Question Survey. We had 50 responses, which included the 32 attendants at our Town Hall. These responses gave our Search Committee a solid foundation to complete the "why" come to Nativity for candidates. We will be working with Canon Brust to complete our responses to the questions for the portfolio placed on the Diocese Website. Once we have completed our responses from the eleven questions, we will send our completed document to everyone by email, and hard copies will be available in the Narthex.

Our committee chairpersons met, and I am really excited about our upcoming events. We will have so many opportunities to work and worship together. I am asking that you consider participating in these events as you are able and making this an amazing adventure together.

With Fall comes colds, flu, viruses, and the list goes on. Memorial Garden Update


We finally received approval from the city for our revised site and landscape plans! We can begin planting the screening shrubs around the garden to comply with the plan. It's going to be beautiful. Here are some highlights up for Vestry approval on 9/24:

- Plant Clusia shrubs in the areas shown in green clouds below. This drawing is not 100% to scale but is very close. We will tie into existing landscapes and trees.
- Plant approximately 240 linear feet of shrubs around the garden's East and North sides. We
 are using mature shrubs to provide immediate screening and privacy but will decide how
 high to let them grow (likely 6'-10') as time passes, and they get established. Placement will
 also give us room to expand seating and enhance the walkway for wheelchair accessibility
 in the future.
- Plant approximately 90 linear feet of shrubs around the storage buildings to screen them from the neighbors' view. This is a typical code requirement in Port St Lucie.
- Also shown in the drawing are measurements from the existing fire pit (77') and road (146')
 to the preserve's Eastern boundary. This area will remain 100% off-limits, including planting,
 without prior City approval in compliance with the Preserve Management Plan.
- As shared last month, the Scouts are interested in taking on regular maintenance and gardening activities on site, including the upkeep of the Flag Garden. We will develop a work plan with the Scout Leaders very soon.

I realize this approval took much longer than anticipated, but we finally finished it! This is

not the end of planned enhancements for the garden - it's a significant step forward. I will update you on additional projects as details emerge. Thanks for your support and patience!

Book Study Ministry
