
#### Memorial Garden

In preparation for activities in 2025, it's a good time to review where we currently stand and what to expect in the near future.

After months of delay due to changing requirements, we finally received official approval from the City for our revised site and landscape plans. Compliance required implementation of a Preserve Management Plan (drawn on the left side of the drawing below), removal of additional invasive trees, and approval/planting screening shrubs.

- We re-grinded brush on the entire North side of the property so it can be mowed by our landscaper
  who accepted this additional scope as of September. Multiple invasive Schefflera trees were
  removed from the preserve area and stumps ground. We must maintain the preserve including
  prompt removal of any invasive plants/trees that may start to grow.
- We completed planting of approx. 90 Clusia shrubs in the areas shown in green clouds below. These shrubs screen approximately 240 linear feet of the outdoor chapel from the road and also meet City required screening around the storage buildings.
- Upgrades were performed on our sprinkler system/well and the LED sign out front to improve curb appeal.
- Planting beds were weeded and mulched. Thank you, Bill and Ron!

In closing, we've made great progress over the past two years. Maintenance is key - thank you to all our volunteers, especially Bill Shaver and Ron Herman who work tirelessly throughout the year! We need more help maintaining our campus so please consider committing time to this ministry in 2025. Thanks for your continued support, input and grace as we transform our campus!


