Please note: Easter lilies have a fragrance that will permeate the church on Easter Sunday. If you are allergic to flowers, please wear a mask or take other precautions for your health.
- If you would like to honor a loved one with a Memorial Rose, you may do so for a cost of \$10.00. Memorial roses will be added to the altar, and your name will be recognized in the church bulletin. The deadline is April 6.


